
Many Romans were poor and they lived in small houses. But they were happy and liked their emperor because he organized shows for them.

At the amphitheatre, they watched fights between gladiators or between wild animals - for example, an elephant and a buffalo or a rhino and a bear.





At the circus, they watched chariot races. These races were always fast and dangerous. Many charioteers and horses died.




Romans also watched plays at the theatre. Romans liked music, dances and violence in their plays. Actors sometimes killed slaves on the stage.

In 1748 archaeologists discovered the two towns. Now visitors can see the private houses, public buildings and a theatre in Pompeii and the holiday villas in Herculaneum.

The Romans


Rome is the capital city of Italy. Rome was the first city ruled by kings. Some of these kings were very cruel.

Tarquin The Proud was the last king of Rome. He ruled from 534 BC to 510 BC. Tarquin The Proud was overthrown and Rome became a republic for the next four hundred years.

As a republic Rome was ruled by a senate. The senate had senators who were people that were elected to do certain jobs. These senators were elected by Roman citizens voting. Women and slaves were not allowed to vote.


Rome became an Empire. It had a powerful army and ruled many countries from France to Africa. The generals became too powerful and they were always fighting, so they were eventually replaced by one man who was called The Emperor.

The first Emperor of Rome was Augustus. He came into power in 27 BC. Augustus was a peaceful Emperor and was protected by special soldiers called the Praetorian Guard.





Hercules (Heracles in Greek mythology)


For a very long time, Hercules (Heracles) did not know he was half man and half god. His mother was a mortal. But his father was a king - a very special king, the king of all the gods, the mighty Zeus.

Zeus loved his little son. But Hera, Zeus' wife, hated Hercules. She was very jealous: She tried all kinds of ways to kill Hercules, including sending a couple of big snakes into his crib. Hercules crushed those snakes in a flash! Hercules was incredibly strong, even as a baby!

To keep his small son safe from attack, Zeus sent him to live with a mortal family on earth in the ancient Greek city-state of Argos. Hercules grew up noble and loved. He married and had a couple of kids. He was happy, but he did not fit in on earth. He was too big and too strong. He was hard to miss. Hera soon discovered his location.

The rest of the story of Hercules is a bunch of little stories that together tell the tale of how Hercules used clever tricks and great courage to stay alive and earn his way into the heavens, to take his place with the gods.

Legend of the Trojan Horse



Once upon a time, there was an ancient city on the coast of Turkey named Troy. It was near the Greek city of Sparta. When the king of Sparta heard that his wife, the beautiful Helen, had been kidnapped by a prince of Troy, he called on the other Greek city-states to help him get her back. Nobody helped him. A thousand Greek ships went toTroy.

The city of Troy was protected by a high wall built around the city. Some parts of the wall were 6,000 metres tall! There were tall doors to enter and to go out of the city. The Greek soldiers tried to enter the city for ten years but they couldn't.

Then, Odysseus, a famous ancient Greek general, had an idea. It was a tradition in those times to leave a present and admit defeat. Odysseus had this idea: The Greeks built a huge, heavy, beautiful wooden horse, and put it outside the gates of Troy. Then, the entire Greek army pretended to leave, but it was a trick. Thirty men were hiding inside the wooden horse and waited.

When it was ready, the Greek warriors decided to hide. The people of Troy went out, happily. They pulled the huge horse inside the city and celebrated.

That night, while the Trojan people were sleeping, the Greek soldiers hiding inside the wooden horse went out and opened the gates to the city of Troy. The Greek army entered Troy. That was the end of Troy!

Is this old legend true? It certainly is famous. It is known as the legend of the **Trojan horse.**




The **Twelve Olympians** are the most important gods of **Greek mythology**, who lived on Mount Olympus.

The Olympians became the most important gods when Zeus and his brothers and sisters won a war against the Titans. Zeus, Hera, Poseidon, Demeter, Hestia, and Hades are all brothers and sisters. All the other gods are Zeus's children and have different mothers.

Gods who are Olympians

- Zeus is the most important god. He is the ruler of Mount Olympus and is the god of the weather
- Poseidon is the god of the oceans.
- Hera is Zeus' wife. She is the goddess of marriage.
- Ares is the god of war and violence.
- Artemis is the goddess of hunting and animals.
- Hephaestus is the god of fire..
- Apollo is the god of light, dance, music, and medicine poems.
- Hermes is the messenger of the gods. He is also the god of travelers, thieves and shepherds.
- Hestia is the goddess of the home and family.

- Athena is the goddess of wisdom, the arts, industry, justice and skill.







TOYS IN ANCIENT GREECE

Children who died in ancient Greece were buried with their toys in a burial ritual. The toys might have been their favourites, or they might have been specially made for the child to play with in the next life.


One type of Greek toy that archaeologists have unearthed is a baby's rattle. It is made from clay and is hollow and shaped like an animal. Small clay beads were dropped inside the hollow shape before it dried. Then the toy rattled when the child shook it, just as modern, plastic rattles do today.



Greek children had dolls made from clay which were very similar to those played with by Egyptian children. Greek dolls were brightly painted with moveable arms and legs attached by strips of leather.

Just as today's children play with model cars and aeroplanes, Greek children played with models of chariots. In fact, Greek children played with many of the toys which are similar to those children play with today, including string puppets, toy soldiers, yo-yos, skipping ropes, whistles and hoops.

Greek children stopped playing with their toys when they reached 13 years. This birthday was very important because it showed that they were adults and must give their childish toys up to their gods.




GAMES IN ANCIENT GREECE

The Greeks, like the Egyptians, enjoyed playing games outdoors. Children played at tug of war, on see-saws and they took part in ball games similar to hockey. They also played knucklebones (known today as chuck-stones or five-stones).

The ball games could be very rough. One piggyback game involved two teams fighting for a ball that was thrown between them.

We know about many of these games from paintings on pottery, but don't know exactly what the rules were. In one painting, players throw a ball at a row of sticks. The game looks a little like cricket.



The first Olympic games were held around 776 BC and then every four years after that. At first the games were simply 190m races, or the length of the stadium. At the 14th Olympic Games, another race of twice the length was added. Over the years other new sports were included such as wrestling, where kicking, arm-twisting and jumping on the opponent were allowed; boxing; throwing the discus; long jump, from standing still; throwing the javelin; relay races, carrying a flaming torch for a baton and chariot racing.

There were also Junior Olympics, but only boys could enter these. Girls and women could not take part in the Games and were not allowed to watch.






- If you drop one then the turn passes to the next player.

The winner is the first to catch all five cubes, either in the first throw or by playing 'ones'.




TOYS IN ANCIENT ROME

In 146 BC the Roman army defeated the Greeks and began to rule in Greece. The Romans allowed the Olympic Games to continue for a few hundred years but the Games were finally banned in 394 AD.

The Romans imitated the Greeks in many ways. The children played with clay dolls and see-saws which were very similar to those used by Greek children. Some new Roman toys included kites, building bricks and swings. Roman children also played with marbles made from glass or clay.




Roman children played many of the same games as the Greeks but also invented others which are still popular today, such as Hide and Seek, Tag, Leapfrog, Hopscotch and Blind Man's Buff.

Children invented games from whatever they could find lying around. One game was called 'Nuts'. Each child had some hazelnuts and took turns placing a nut very carefully on a pile. The one who made the pile collapse lost the game. When nuts were not in season, they probably used stones or small sticks for this game.
